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National Youth Council and Nanyang Polytechnic deepen digital transformation partnership with new Skills Accelerator Programme

Renewal of three-year Memorandum of Understanding expected to save up to 1,000 manhours annually

In the past three years from December 2019 to November 2022, the National Youth Council (NYC) has benefitted from solutions by Nanyang Polytechnic (NYP) to save 3,000 manhours through the automation of repetitive administrative work. The partnership has also enabled 150 NYC officers to focus on higher value job roles, 45 of whom were also trained to become UiPath¹ Citizen Developers. Another eight NYP School of Information Technology (SIT) students were given the opportunity to solve industry transformation challenges² with Robotic Process Automation (RPA) solutions through internships across NYC's divisions. The implementation of RPA solutions across work processes in NYC was facilitated through a three-year Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with NYP's SIT – a UiPath Academic Alliance partner – signed in 2019.

MOU renewal will focus on workforce transformation

- With a focus of building the workforce of tomorrow and a strong belief that people are at the heart of digital transformation, the MOU between NYP and NYC has been renewed for another three years in November 2022, with a new Skills-Up Accelerator programme for three NYC staff as a pilot run.
- Aligned to NYP's strategic goal to further deepen industry partnerships, NYP will work in tandem with NYC to further strengthen NYC officers' digital capabilities. NYP lecturers will coach selected NYC staff to help them build deep RPA skills, based on their unique business project needs. These NYC staff will also receive individualised training plans to learn more about the UiPath tools and design of RPA solutions. On top of a capstone project that will improve existing processes in NYC, the six-month on-the-job attachment will also prepare participants for the UiPath certification.

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- Under the new MOU, RPA solutioning will expand to NYC's sub-divisions, Youth Corps Singapore (YCS³) and Outward Bound Singapore (OBS⁴), to improve process efficiencies and staff up-skilling in 10 areas of grant processing and programme management. Around 700 and 1,000 man-hours respectively are expected to be saved annually in the next three years as NYC presses on with its digital and workforce transformation efforts. Up to five internship opportunities for NYP's students will be available as well.
- "Digital transformation has enabled NYC to focus on our mission, and to empower youths in Singapore to achieve their goals and contribute back to society meaningfully. The time saved with digital solutions has allowed us to expeditiously address the needs and aspirations of youths, and be more involved in understanding young people better. I look forward to another successful partnership with Nanyang Polytechnic for our staff and students." said Chief Executive of the National Youth Council, Mr David Chua.

Processing Grant Disbursement for National Youth Fund To process weekly grant for National Youth Fund	Reduces the risk of human error by validating each supporting submission and saves hours by automatically routing each submission for approval. Staff will continue to have central oversight over the project status in terms of payment advice submission.
E-invoice routing & processing Route e-invoices to requesting officer and processing of invoices	Saves time and decreases human error by coordinating routing of e-invoices to the respective officers involved.
Staff Onboarding for HR To simplify the onboarding process by automating steps that require high volumes of repetitive administrative tasks such as account generation for various systems including LEARN and Workplace, activate sub-task to various parties such as Finance, IT (for computing assets), facilities (for card access and telephone number), updating Vital on various admin needs, dispatching reminders to RO and Senior Management on the incoming staff and keeping track of Green Harvesting cases.
